"The Velzer Rebber would travel to Uman every year for Shabbes Nachmu and read the haftorah Nachmu Nachmu. The Rebbe explained that Shabbes Nachmu was a most propitious occasion to be in Uman and be doubly consoled, once Nachmu for the Breslevar Rebbe no longer with his chaseedem and again Nachmu for the Breslevar chaseedem no longer with their Rebbe. The Velzer Rebbe pointed out that the word Nachmu contains the name Uman with the added letter "ches", representing the 7 weeks of consolation leading up to Rosh Hashanah plus the 8<sup>th</sup> week of Tshuva leading to Yom Kippur. The Velzer Rebbe would visit the Uman National University of Horticulture and bring back from Uman 8 varieties of seed and bring one to his Tish at each of the 8 meals of Rosh Hashanah (4) Shabbes Shuva (3) and Erev Yom Kippur (1). On each occasion, the Velzer Rebbe would recite a special Yehi Ratzon sh'hatzadikim yiree veyismoochee V'CHASEEDIM b'reenu yoogilee."-Rabbi Mel Teitelbaum
